

Questions and Answers about "Vaccination against new strains of coronavirus in Gunma Prefecture (For students)"

June 24, 2021

Q. How can I be vaccinated?

A. There are three ways to receive the vaccine: individual vaccination, large-scale vaccination, and "regional vaccination", as described below. Whichever method you choose, please get vaccinated if you have the opportunity. Outside of the prefecture, vaccinations are also available at the Self-Defense Forces Large-Scale Vaccination Center (Otemachi Joint Government Building No. 3, 1-3-3 Otemachi, Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo) (vaccination ticket required).

"Regional vaccination" is under considering now.

Q: What should I do if I do not have a residence certificate in Gunma Prefecture?

A The city, town, or village where you live will issue you a vaccination ticket. If your residence card is in the prefecture, you can get vaccinated at the Prefectural Vaccination Center (G-Messe Gunma). The same applies to international students with a residence certificate in the prefecture.

If your residence is outside of the prefecture (and you do not have a vaccination ticket issued by a municipality within the prefecture), you cannot be vaccinated at the Prefectural Vaccination Center (G-Messe Gunma). You will have to be vaccinated at Regional vaccination or at your residence place. We will contact you again regarding the Regional vaccination.

Q What should I do if I have an adverse reaction?

A It is said that symptoms such as pain in the vaccination site or fever may appear within a few days after vaccination. In such cases, please take it easy and recuperate, and if necessary, see your family doctor.

In Gunma Prefecture, a telephone consultation service called "Gunma Corona Vaccine Dial" has been set up.

In addition, if you need to receive medical treatment due to symptoms that are considered to be highly related to the vaccination, or if you have symptoms of injury or illness in addition to fever, headache, fatigue, etc. as an adverse reaction, please consult with the instructor in charge of the class.

Q. Will I have problems in my classes if I don't get vaccinated?

A We expect students to be proactive about getting vaccinated, but vaccination is voluntary and not mandatory, and those who do not get vaccinated are not disadvantaged. Specific measures will vary from class to class, so please consult with the instructor in charge of your class.
