Gunma University Summer Session 2025 Application Guidelines

1. Objective

This session is designed for undergraduate and graduate students from Gunma University's partner institutions. Over the course of five days, participants will engage in hands-on learning experiences unique to Japan and Gunma. Through project-based learning (PBL) that encourages observation, critical thinking, and teamwork, students will complete a group project. The goal of the session is to deepen participants' interest in Gunma University.

2. Eligibility and Requirements

- Must be enrolled as an undergraduate or graduate student at a Gunma University partner institution at the time of the session.
- Must belong to a university that received this invitation.
- Must have sufficient English proficiency to understand lectures conducted in English.
- Must be willing to actively participate in group work.
- Must be available to attend all five days of the session.
- Must purchase overseas travel insurance before arrival in Japan.

3. Period, Capacity, and Fees

4. Overview

This session focuses on lectures and hands-on experiences related to Japanese language and culture, regional aspects of Gunma, and research and industries connected to Gunma University. It is primarily conducted in English and also provides opportunities to interact with Japanese students.

Over the course of five days, participants will engage in unique, Gunma-specific activities designed to foster independent thinking through Project-Based Learning (PBL). PBL is a form of active learning in which students identify their own questions or challenges, conduct research and analysis, deepen their understanding through group discussions, and ultimately present their findings.

As the final outcome of the session, participants will create a "Creative Flyer." Based on what they have learned and experienced during the five days, each group will work collaboratively to design a flyer that promotes either Gunma or Gunma University.
